Dear Friends in Christ:

Epiphany is the ecclesiastical season which follows Christmas. January 6 is the Day of Epiphany, and it marks the arrival of the 3 kings or wisemen. Our creches and our songs all say 3 wisemen because they brought 3 gifts. The season of Epiphany runs until Ash Wednesday, which is February 14, this year.

I am especially excited for Epiphany this year. I will be in Florence, Italy, on January 6. Florence traditionally has a long, grand Epiphany parade with magnificent costumes. The celebration dates back to 1417, but was halted in 1494 when the Medici family was expelled from Florence. A live nativity scene is set up in the Piazza Duomo.

I will be in Italy, with Michon co-leading a St. Olaf J-term course. It is similar to last year's course, but edited. This year, we will spend two weeks in Florence, one week in Rome, and the final week in Sicily. Michon and I are leaving a couple days early so that we can go to Assisi, where the mystic and friar St. Francis lived. The current pope is Pope Francis, and he has modeled his ministry and life on Francis's dedication to the poor and his life of simplicity. St. Peter's, as well as many other congregations, has an annual blessing of the animals/pets on or near October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi.

You may also know his prayer:

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy."

We will be in Rome on Sunday, January 21. We are hopeful that we can go to the outdoor square at St. Peter's Basilica. After mass, the Pope traditionally greets the crowds from a balcony.

In Sicily we will see the convergence of many ancient cultures—the Romans, Greeks, and the Normans.

I am grateful for this opportunity to learn more Christian history, and see many important and historic churches, paintings, and sculptures.

I trust that our travels and tours will offer many epiphanies–new insights, new ways of seeing God's love in Jesus, and new discoveries of the Church's history.

Music Notes

A few years ago in the Parish Visitor, I wrote about my family's tradition of celebrating Epiphany with a "King's Cake", which included 3 hidden almonds in the batter. Whoever found each of the almonds were the "3 kings" for the day.

I have been curious about other traditions of Epiphany which happen throughout the world. I was able to find lots of information with just a little snooping on the internet! Let me share with you some of the traditions!



You've probably heard about "Twelfth Night". This is a festival for Epiphany Eve or the day of Epiphany – depending on which tradition you start counting the 12 days of Christmas. In the UK, a punch called wassail is served on this night, as well as the Twelfth-cake (or "King's Cake"). In France, the King's Cake is eaten all month long! Some traditions say all decorations must come down by the end of Twelfth Night. In former French colonies, this marks the start of the Carnival season.

Originating in the Medieval Europe, people practice "Chalking the Door". This tradition blesses your home.

Christians write on their doors a pattern of numbers and symbols, such as:



20 TCTM TBT 24

The numbers reference the calendar year.
The letters C, M, B refer to the traditional names of the Magi
(Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar)
or can also be from the Latin blessing,
"Christus mansionem benedicat"
("May Christ bless this house").



In some parts of the world, particularly Spanish-speaking countries, children receive their gifts on the Feast of the Epiphany, marking the end of the Christmas season. In France, men dress up as kings and pass out candy in the streets. Epiphany is a national holiday in many countries.

Traditionally, Epiphany gets its own liturgical season, linking the Nativity with the Passion (Ash Wednesday). The readings during this season focus not only on the biblical Magi and star story, but also the baptism of Jesus and Jesus' miracle of turning water to wine at the wedding in Cana. These are considered manifestations of God in Jesus' life: light, water, and wine.



TAKE HEART: Our former St. Olaf intern, Maddi Froiland along with her mother, Rev. Dr. Lisa Bates-Froiland, are working on a project with Jesuit priest Garrett Gundlach of Racine, WI to distribute 8,000 olive wood hearts that were used in a worship service on Dec 28, 2023, at the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem to commemorate the Slaughter of the Innocents (long-standing date on the Christian Church calendar). Maddi lives in Jerusalem, and visited the Bethlehem woodworking factory in December, and saw first-hand the beautiful work they do. St. Peter's has ordered 100 of these hearts, available for you to purchase at \$3 each. We will use them in our Ash Wednesday service (which falls on Valentine's Day) and then distribute them to those who have purchased them. Please consider purchasing a heart to support the work of Palestinians in the Holy Land. More information to come soon.



Council Highlights

To express God's love and grace in building a community where people **believe** in God, **belong** to Christ, and **become** disciples who serve in day to day living.

Devotion: Lead by Pastor Weeks read a message sent out by Bishop Hassanally based on Genesis 3 and "The Burning Bush" In this season of Advent, be invited to acknowledge God, turn toward God not away and see the places that God is present everyday.

Staff Reports: Steve Hill, Mark Shaw, David Hendee & Phil Olson have been busy moving, rearranging & purging items to make way for the Southeastern Minnesota Synod office. All exterior doors have been rekeyed; New keys shall be given out and tracked by Allie. Presently, 67 estimates of giving have been received. Pastor will be traveling Jan 1st through Jan 28th, using a combination of vacation & continuing education time accompanying Michon as the Program Assistant for Italian Art in Context, a St. Olaf J-term course, traveling in Florence, Rome, and Polemermo (Sicily).

Treasurer's Report: Income for November was \$30,302 - Slightly under the projected income by \$788. Expenses for the month of November were \$30,222; below the budgeted expenses by \$2,270. Olson reminded council that the approved budget for 2023 was operating with a deficit budget of \$18,000 - but shines a light that with 2023 coming to a close St Peter's may break even! The operating budget for 2024 will be presented to council at the January meeting and then presented to the congregation at the annual meeting in February.

Maintenance Report: Preparation for the SE MN Synod move is fully underway! Carpeting is being replaced in the areas that the Synod will be using. The synod plans to paint the rooms at their expense. It was discovered that the electrical panel is in need of replacement. This work is being done by Guth electric. Other maintenance issues included the parking lot lights, updating the lighting in the atrium outside the fellowship hall and creating a plan for better directional signage for both visitors and members.
